






KARGIL VIJAY DIWAS



Getting selected for 64th NSCC 2021 among '13 lakh' NCC cadets was a matter of great pride and honour for JUO Akhilesh Goswami.



And then the day came, when results were declared and he was selected for All India Ganesh Vasudev Mavlankar Shooting Championship (AIGVMSC-2021) in small bore 3 Position Junior men rifle event. But competition was not limited to NCC

The competition consists of 0.22 Bore Rifle Firing test, Personal interview, written test of General knowledge and NCC specific knowledge, squad drill and word of command test. It was conducted on 9 October and 10 October 2021 for Gp 'C' Delhi Dte. 2 Delhi Naval Unit was in charge of conducting the competition. 






ALL INDIA TREKKING EXPEDITION




PATRATU, BIHAR AND JHARKHAND TREK

The Trek aimed at inculcating spirit of adventure, love for outdoor life, nature, develop stamina, endurance and esprit-de-corps among the NCC cadets. The trek also promoted knowledge of local customs, religious beliefs, culture and history of the trek.

During the trek cadets visited beautiful places such as Palani Waterfalls, Patratu Valley, Patratu Dam, Hanuman Temple in Patratu and walked through Railway Tunnel. SHIVAJI TRAIL TREK 2021

"When you are enthusiastic, the mountain also looks like a clay pile." – Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj

SUO Prakhar Mishra participated in the ALL INDIA TREKKING EXPEDITION (Kolhapur) MAHARASHTRA from 24th November 2021 to 4th of December 2021. The trek tries to teach children about the campaigns of Chatrapati Shivaji maharaj specially about the seige of the Panhala fort located in the present day Kolhapur. The trek is along the path taken by Chatrapati Shivaji maharaj to escape the seige of Panhala by commanders of the sultan of Bijapur Siddi Johar to capture Chatrapati in 1659. On the verge of capture Shivaji Maharaj fled to Vishalgarh with his trusted general Baji Prabhu Deshpande who laid down his life while defending Chatrapati in the battle of Pawankhind. Finally the fort was recaptured by Chatrapati Shivaji Maharaj in 1673 permanently. Panhala is a strategic fort looking over a pass in Sahyadri mountain range which was a major trade route between Bijapur in the interior of Maharashtra to the coastal areas. Here SUO Prakhar also got an opprtunity to meet the ADG of Maharashtra Directorate Major General YP Khandouri. Overall the trek was a great learning experience.









ENROLLMENT DRIVE

On 22 Dec, 2021, Enrolment drive for 1st year student's in DCAC NCC was conducted at NCC Bhawan, Rohini. A total of 106 students filled the from, out of which 31 students appeared for the final Enrolment process in Unit. Eventually, 27 were able to make in final list. ARMY DAY PARADE 2022

CDT RITWIK, CDT HARSH, CDT MUKESH, CDT ROHIT and CDT UJJAWAL got the opportunity of attending the 74th army day parade at Cariappa parade ground, New Delhi on 15th January 2022. This day is a matter of great pride for every Indian, as we pay our respects to the daredevils of our country and salute them for the sacrifices they make each day for the country. This year's parade began with the Chiefs of India's three armed forces paying tribute to the martyrs at the National War Memorial by laying a flower wreath. The tribute-paying ceremony was followed by an address by the Army Chief General Manoj Mukund Naravane, In which he mentioned the situation at the Line of Actual Control (LAC) and reforms to bring gender equality in the Indian armed forces. Many soldiers were felicitated with gallantry medals for their courage and valour. This year's parade was unique as the contingent of different regiments were seen marching in uniforms belonging to the 1950-60s era. The new combat uniform which was made in collaboration with National institute Of Fashion Technology (NIFT) worn by the Parachute Regiment commandos were also revealed in the parade. The parade was followed by electrifying drills performed by the soldiers. The replications of wars such as War of 1971, The surgical strike (2016) etc. were made through drills. The New Editions of Tanks and missiles inducted in the Indian Army were also displayed.





PARA SLITHERING CAMP 2022

Para-Slithering is an adventurous activity in which NCC cadets having good physical fitness take part after rigorous training lasting up to one and a half month. This activity is a part of Prime Minister's Rally which is conducted every year on 28th of January. NCC training provides knowledge to cadet of the topography as well as experience of different weather conditions and adventurous living under camp condition.

The selection procedure took place in three cadres CADRE 1- 20 December 2021 to 31 December 2021 CADRE 2- 03 January 2022 to 12 January 2022 CADRE 3-13 January 2022 to 29 January 2022





In the final cadre, 25 SD cadets and 25 SW cadets were selected out of which only 13 SD cadets and 13 SW cadets slithered from ALH MK-III and MI-17.Special National Integration camp was also organized along with the third cadre during the camp at the Safdarjung NCC GRP 'C' HQ. . NCC gives the opportunity to participate in host of adventurous activities that enable cadets to hone leadership skills and enhance their character qualities. Most of us dream of flying in the sky. This camp helps cadets to gain one such memorable experience as they get chance to fly from Polo ground to Cariappa parade ground where cadets slither down and shows the action how Army provides enforcement via air. 

EXAMINATION NCC CERTIFICATE "C"

NCC 'C' Certificate Examination is conducted in two parts-(i) Practical (ii) Written Examination

(i) Practical

NCC cadets of Delhi College of Arts and Commerce Attended the "C Certificate Practical" under the guidance of ANO Lt. Bhupinder.

A total of 96 cadets of 7DBN out of which 11 cadets of DCAC Attended the practical in the Cariappa Parade Ground. Around 0845 hrs Investigating officer had An interaction with the cadets and gave his best wishes to the cadets before the Commencement of the practical. Around 0900 hrs the practical examination was started.

First, the cadets moved on to 'Field Craft & Battle Craft and Communication'. In this section viva of all the cadets was conducted. Then, The cadets moved to 'Weapon Drill Test' where they started reporting to the officers and Completed the Weapon Drill procedure along with viva. Once Weapon Drill Test was completed, cadets moved to 'Weapon Training' for 'Kholna Jhorna'. After The mantling and dismantling of SLR 7.62mm Rifle, viva of all the cadets was conducted based on topic weapons and their characteristics. After that, cadets moved To 'Map Reading'. In the Map Reading cadets were provided with a prismatic Compass, service protractor and the map to find the true north and grid system on the Map and then viva was conducted on the topic map reading of all the cadets.



(ii) Written Examination

NCC cadets of Delhi College of Arts and Commerce attended the "C Certificate Examination" under the guidance of ANO Lt. Bhupinder.
